In his decades as a globally recognized teacher, Richard Rohr has helped millions realize what is at stake in matters of faith and spirituality. Too often, Rohr writes, our understandings have been limited by culture, religious debate, and the human tendency to put ourselves at the center.

Thought-provoking, practical, and full of deep hope and vision, The Universal Christ is a landmark book from one of our most beloved spiritual writers, and an invitation to contemplate how God liberates and loves all that is.

We are looking for caring volunteers to help teach Sunday School before worship! This is a wonderful opportunity to share God's love with our children.



They will be discussing the Bible study Romans - Good News that Changes Everything by Melissa Spoelstra.


